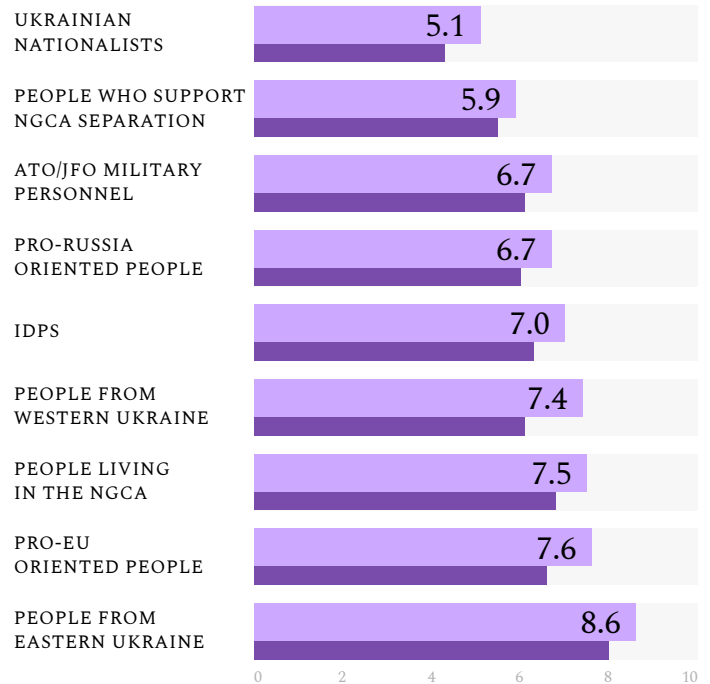


✓ As an intervention, prioritize programmes aimed at improving police's relationship with and responsiveness to citizens and local needs.

CONFIDENCE THAT PEOPLE FROM DIFFERENT GROUPS WILL LISTEN



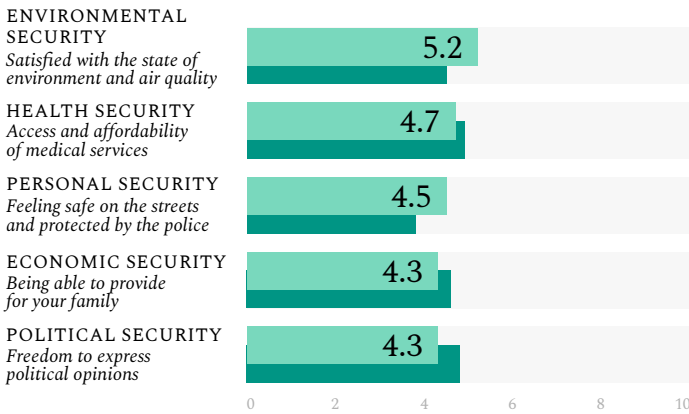

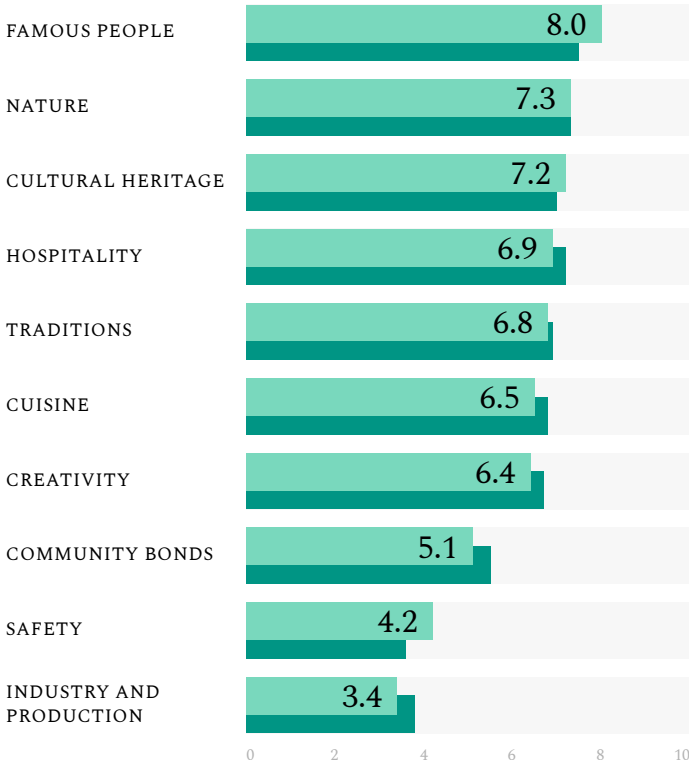

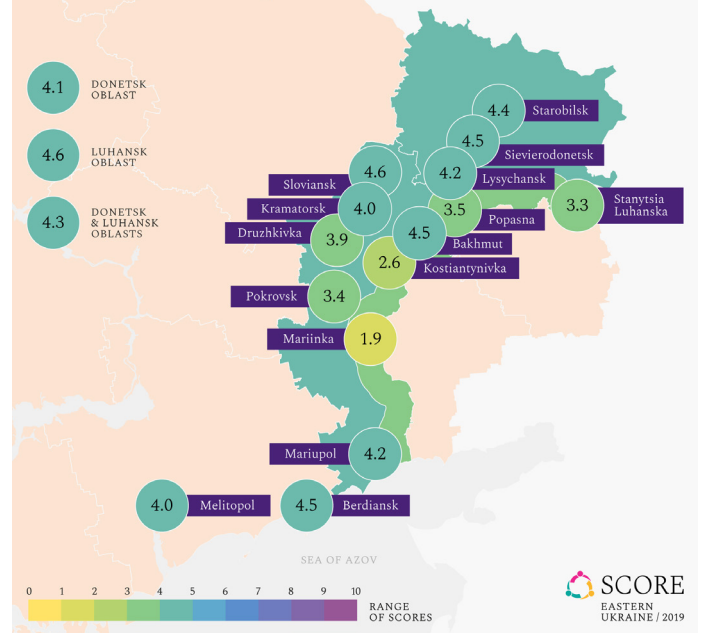
When you think about your locality, to what extent are you proud of the following?

(in terms of jobs, leisure activities and raising children)



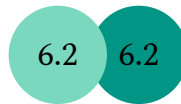
PERSONAL SECURITY

✓ *Recommended interventions should focus on increasing sense of safety and the communication between police and the citizens.*

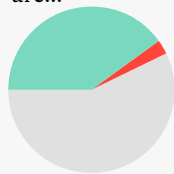
PRIDE IN LOCALITY (OVERALL)



The sense of pride about the city's safety is well-above the region's average (3.6 for 15 cities studied). However, this level is still pretty low. The identity of "safe Bakhmut" must be strengthened by improving citizens' relationship with the police and local institutions.
